Rebuilding in God's Vision

*“As soon as I heard these words I sat down and wept and mourned for days, and I continued fasting and praying before the God of heaven. And I said, “O LORD God of heaven, the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you ... They are your servants and your people, whom you have redeemed by your great power and by your strong hand.”
Nehemiah 1:4-6a,10 (ESV)*

This is the prayer Nehemiah speaks to God on behalf of Israel and himself. It is a plea for mercy and direction for God's people. In recent months, there has been a pull to re-read the book of Nehemiah. What follows from Nehemiah's prayer is a vision/direction to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. This task to rebuild the walls is not for the faint of heart. It seems like an unsurmountable task for Nehemiah to undertake. However, God has placed upon him the task that must be accomplished.

We all have received direction in our lives from God whether we like it or not. Sometimes the direction may even be the direction/vision for the ministry. The vision must come first before anything can be made real. In the past, we've been like Nehemiah in that we realized God's vision for the ministry, but it was not real within us and because of this, the Evil One sprung into action with his temptations leading us to depart from the appointed vision by God.

“And the parched ground shall become a pool.” Isaiah 35:7 (KJV)

*I have called you by
name, you are mine.*

We often forget as God places the vision for the ministry before us, He must first take us down into the lower valley to mold and batter us into the shape of the vision, and it is during that time in the valley that so many of us faint and give way. It is through this fire and water that He transforms us. One thing is true, if we trust and are diligent in God's direction and plan we will see His vision for the ministry be made real. Where we are embarking is not a quick trip, even though we are always in a hurry. We go through the motions, but haven't really grasped the fullness of the vision in our personal lives. God remedies this by taking us to the valley putting us through the refiner's fire and cleansing waters.

"Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." Isaiah 43:1b-3a (ESV)

Over the course of the year, Trinity Lutheran Ministries' vision will be unpacked for you so that collectively we may be molded and battered together while preparing for God's desired vision for Trinity. I invite you to not lose heart through the process and journey. Rest assured, God is with us through it all and will maintain us. He will also accomplish His plan for the ministry, it is our job to realize we are called to seek and follow His direction. In seeking His direction and following His vision, we can fully understand what it means to be ***Blessed By the Lord!***

At the May and June 2017 Church Council meetings, the following business was conducted:

- We approved the reappointment of Connie Blackwood to serve another three-year term on the School Board.
- We elected the following as officers – Phil Moilanen as Chairperson, Steve Lazaroff as Vice Chairperson, Mike Way as Treasurer, and Jean Yohe as Secretary.
- We approved Church Worker Scholarships as recommended by the CWS Committee for Andrea Dent, Matthew Dubensky, Clint Genthner and Cassidy Holeso. Total amount awarded was \$8,000.
- We adopted the document “Guidelines for Assisting Employees Not Performing at Expected Levels” as a support document when completing annual performance evaluations.
- We agreed to make recommendations to the congregation that, in order to meet our financial obligations and pursuant to the Reduction in Force Policy 301, we release Early Childhood Center Director Gloria Fahlsing from her call; release Associate Pastor Hanson from his call; release Office Assistant Karolyn Pfeiffer from her part-time employment. We then set July 9 as a Special Voters’ Assembly meeting to discuss and act on the above.

150th Anniversary Celebration

The beginning of our 150th year celebration is fast approaching!! Great is God's Faithfulness!

Trinity's 150th Anniversary celebrations begin October 21-22 with two wonderful events for current and past members and the Jackson community.

On Saturday afternoon, October 21, Trinity Lutheran School will be transformed into the Trinity Museum. Six historic galleries will show how our church, the Jackson community, and the nation were shaped through these eras:

- The Founding Years: Trinity is founded during a time of German immigration and the Civil War (1860-1875)
- Becoming American: Trinity transforms from German to English and loses its school, through forces created by World War I (1910-1930)
- Mid-century Growth: Jackson's vitality through World War II and the 1950s
- Renovation and New Starts: Reopening the school and renovating the church (1960s and 1970s)
- Mission Outreach in Times of Struggle: A new focus on international missions and early childhood ministries (1980s into the 21st century)
- Today and Tomorrow

The Trinity Museum, which will fill nearly half the school building, will include historical photos and documents, uniforms and clothing from each era, newspaper and video clips, and a wealth of artifacts provided by the Ella Sharp Museum and others. Fun "eye spy" activities will be available for children, along with snacks or refreshments from each period of history.

Make plans to join us for an enjoyable and memorable afternoon that will provide a window into the growth of our church from its earliest moments and into the future.
